


In case of Flood Alert, everyone inside a building must leave it immediately and go to the following area:

#### FLOOD ALERT WHAT IT MEANS

Dams are extremely safe constructions: their integrity is constantly monitored and verified according to the strict guidelines of the Swiss Federal Office of Energy.

Should an extreme event hypothetically cause problems to a dam, an action plan is ready to be put into practice. This includes the lowering of the basin through the bottom drain as well as the activation of an alarm system to alert people and evacuate the population located within the flooding area, if necessary.

As a rule, the **General Alarm** sounds first followed by an official statement by the Authorities broadcast through the national radio stations.

If the situation requires to rapidly leave the area underneath the dam, the **Water Alarm** will be activated: its sound alerts of an imminent danger and orders to immediately leave the flooding area and reach the elevated assembly points.

### BEHAVIOURAL RULES GENERAL ALARM




Continuous modulated sound for a duration of 1 minute and repeated a second time within 5 minutes.



In case of any doubts regarding the dam security, a **General Alarm** is activated followed by an official statement by the Authorities broadcast through the national radio stations.

## BEHAVIOURAL RULES FLOOD ALARM



Twelve continuous low frequency sounds in sequences of 20 seconds at 10 second intervals for a total duration of 6 minutes



In case of Water Alarm, everybody within the flooding risk area must **IMMEDIATELY** go to the elevated assembly point, as indicated in the Flood Alarm notice boards hanging in buildings and downloadable from **www.ti.ch/allarmi**.

- 1. Listen to the radio
- 2. Follow the instructions given by the Authorities
- 3. Inform neighbours
- 4. Prepare for a possible evacuation

- 1. Leave immediately and reach your assembly point
- 2. Do not use vehicles
- 3. At the assembly point follow the instructions by the Authorities
